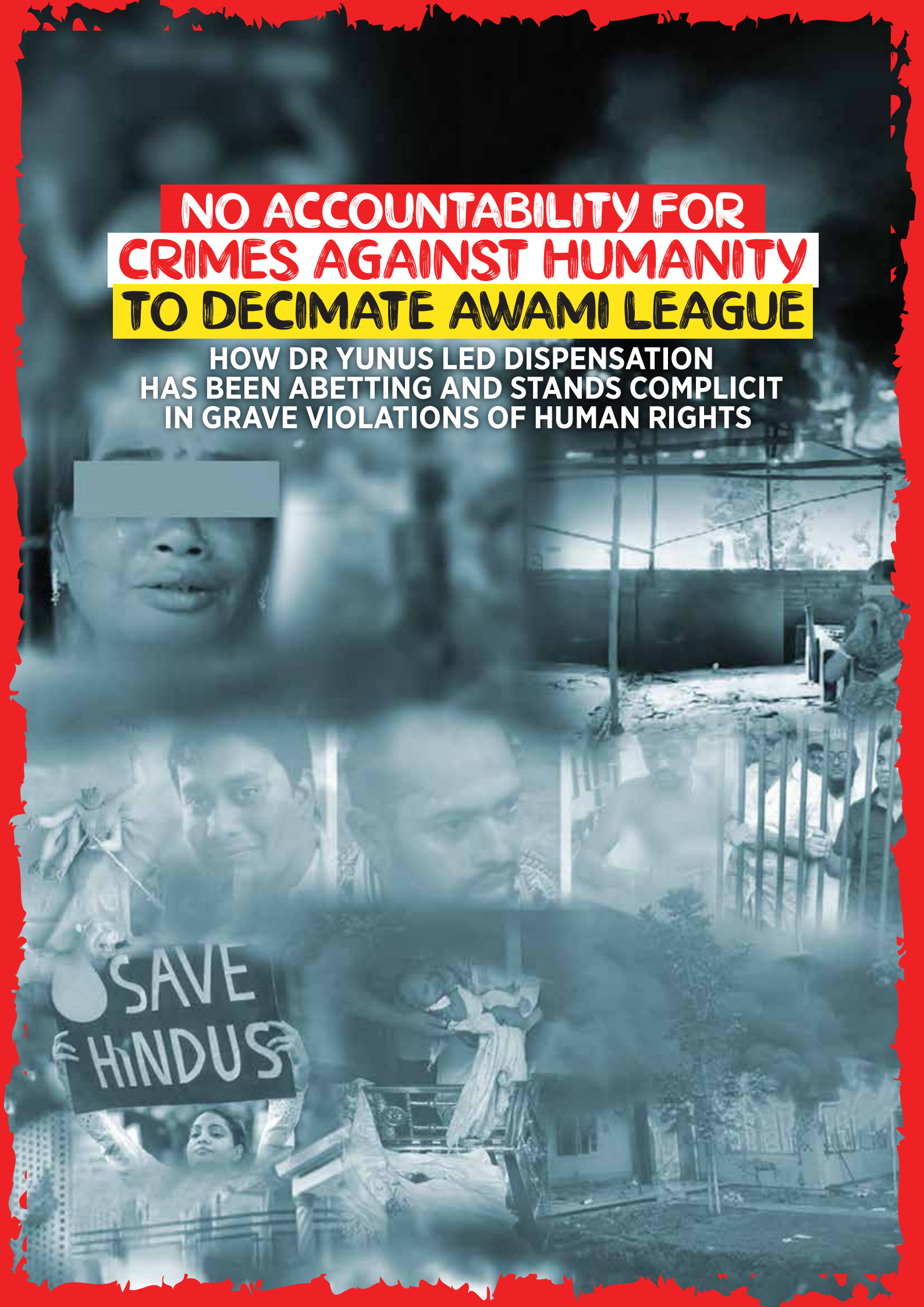


**NO ACCOUNTABILITY FOR
CRIMES AGAINST HUMANITY
TO DECIMATE AWAMI LEAGUE**

**HOW DR YUNUS LED DISPENSATION
HAS BEEN ABETTING AND STANDS COMPLICIT
IN GRAVE VIOLATIONS OF HUMAN RIGHTS**



While Sheikh Hasina left the country to avoid any further bloodshed on August 5, over the space of last 50 days, since her departure, a coordinated and systematic wave of mass killing, physical assault, looting and vandalism of businesses and residences, alongside freedom of speech unrolled on citizens affiliated with Awami League across the country. Right to safety and right to freedom of assembly have been totally strangled for people viewed as dissenters by the dispensation and its supporters including BNP and Jamaat e Islami among other Islamist parties, in stark contrast to rights bodies call to stop cycle of violence.

On the other hand, in the pretext of holding trial of deceased of July- August, wholesale filing of murder charges, described by rights activists as outrageous, fabricated and motivated, employed to criminalise citizens including writers, poets, businesses, free thinkers and liberals indiscriminately, let alone arbitrary detention and unlawful incarceration goes on full swing, with victims denied rights to self defence, a total violation to commitment of ensuring inclusive society and human rights.

Amid denial and impunity from the head of the regime, nobel peace laureate Dr Yunus, the ongoing pogrom to decimate Awami League supporters only getting intensified everyday with a total absence of accountability from any section, offering a free reign for the perpetrators.

On the other hand, the extent of the pogrom also engulfed the minorities with killing, rape, looting and attacks on business establishment, residences and worship places marked alarming rise amid a similar denial from Dr Yunus, fueled by impunity.

This compilation only takes into account some of media reports alongside first hand accounts of victims, while it is noteworthy to mention countless cases of human rights abuses are still undocumented as victims are in fear of reprisal and staying in hiding.

Extrajudicial killing of Awami League activists by law enforcement under custody

Two persons affiliated with Awami League were allegedly tortured to death during a raid of the law enforcement agencies in Saghata of Gaibandha at early hours on September 10. According to family members of the victims they were beaten to death by members of the enforcement agencies and another injured who happened to be an elected local government representative and local Awami League leader told media they were beaten up with false allegations of possessing arms. A denial drama staged by law enforcement on the killing, a message for families to not seek justice.



Politically motivated extrajudicial killing and lynching

In a space of almost three months since August till October at least 700 lives were perished from lynching to politically motivated targeted killing among other acts tantamount to crimes against humanity, according to documentation of rights bodies while around 11000 people sustained injuries. Of the deceased, 91 killed in October, 84 in September and 541 in August respectively. Importantly, 84 lives perished in mob lynching.

With tens of thousands of party activists have been driven out of homes and remained missing, the tally of total causality still remains undocumented.

Former student wing leader of Awami League lynched, no investigation

Despite maimed in an attack on morning 29 April 2014 that caused one leg amputated reportedly by Islami Chhatra Shibir, Abdullah Al Masud, was beaten to death at a market as he went to buy medicine from infirmary. Instead of taken to hospital, his killers brought him in police station to frame him as a criminal in a false case, according to family members of slain leaders. Police allowed full impunity for the killers, leaving the family in further insecurity.

Ex-BCL leader murder: A few questions

The murder of ex-Bangladesh Chhatra League leader Abdullah Al Masud has given rise to a few questions even the police cannot.

He came under an attack in Binodpur bazaar adjacent to Rajshahi University on Tuesday night, and the former leader of Rajshahi University wing of BCL, the student wing of Awami League, was critically injured.

Boalis police station officer in-charge (IC) SM Masud Pervez said Abdullah was attacked on charges of attacking the students and the general people on 7 August.

Questions have been raised as to why officials at the Motihar police station didn't take injured Abdullah Al Masud to a hospital, why did they allow the students to take him to the Boalis police station and why the police didn't arrest the students.

He also said a group of students first brought Abdullah Al Masud to Motihar police station. As there were no cases related to violence on 7 August with the Motihar police station, the IC said, he was then taken to the Boalis police station so that Abdullah could be shown arrested in any violence-related case.

Mob beats ex-BCL leader to death



Abdullah Al Masud, a store officer at Rajshahi University Medical Centre, stepped out of his home on Saturday night to get medicine. Before leaving, he shared on Facebook that he had become a father a few days ago and sought blessings for his newborn daughter.

But little did he know that, by the cruel hand of fate, he would not return to his family alive and that his newborn would grow up without knowing her father.

That night, Masud, also a former Chhatra League leader, died after being beaten by an unruly mob in the Binodpur Bazaar area adjacent to Rajshahi University.

Masud was handed over to police with serious injuries. Later, he was taken to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital, where he died around 12:30am yesterday.

Boalis Police Station Officer in Charge SM Masud Pervez confirmed the matter to The Daily Star.

Police yet to start investigation



Investigation into the case filed over the death of former Chhatra League (BCL) leader Abdullah Al Masud in a "mob beating" is yet to begin, although over a week has already elapsed since the filing of the case.

On September 11, Masud's elder brother Md Behesty filed a murder case against unnamed people with Motihar Police Station in Rajshahi city, four days after Masud's death on September 7.


Aug 15 Attack at Dhanmondi-32: Injured Lakshmipur AL leader dies

Investigation laid bare drama of “mob lynching and recovery of illegal arms” to hide a politically motivated murder of leader of Awami League’s youth front

Awami League leader beaten to death in Noakhali, drama staged to cover up the killing as mob justice

On September 29, according to media reports, Mohammad Shahid, 43, a member of the convening committee of East Chramtua Union for Awami League’s youth front, was beaten by rival activists of Bangladesh Nationalist Party. But law enforcement officials from police told media they rescued the now deceased from a mob with a short gun, concealing the identity of the killers. Later media report citing locals and witnesses exposed the deceased was unarmed and murdered by opponents. Reports reveal the law enforcement did not arrest the killers from the spot.



Outright denial triggering impunity

Despite these overwhelming evidences, Dr Yunus told NPR, “Revenge period was only a couple of weeks maybe. But then normalcy started coming back so we are running the country. There are demonstrations, not revenge demonstrations.” Dr Yunus told NYtimes “Nobody in Bangladesh is victim for political belief right now in Bangladesh. Nobody is saying you are from that party so you should be punished, no body is saying that”.

Jubo League leader hacked to death in Ctg



On October 19, an unarmed Firoz Khan, 35, organising secretary of Baraiyadhala union unit Jubo League, was beaten to death in Sitakunda upazila of port city. Jubo League is the youth front of Awami League



On October 26, Mim, 25, son of Abdul Momen of Ramchandrapur area, abducted, beaten and stabbed to death in Rajshahi. Political violence: Nine Awami League men killed in October: MSF. According to rights organization, Bangladesh Nationalist Party and Jamaat-e-Islami had reportedly involved in four deaths and others were killed on violence fueled by political vendetta.

Thousands of offices of Awami League looted, torched and gabbed with full impunity

The office of the party president Sheikh Hasina in Dhanmondi, the central party office in Gulistan and Ganabhaban have looted and torched. Similarly, offices in divisional headquarters and 4,571 Unions alongside 495 upazilas were completely looted attacked and/or occupied.

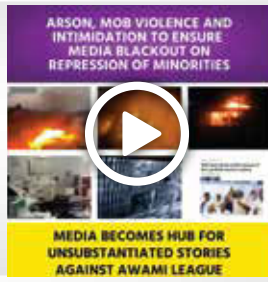

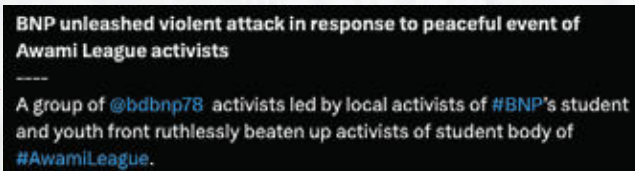
No Freedom for peaceful assembly for Awami League

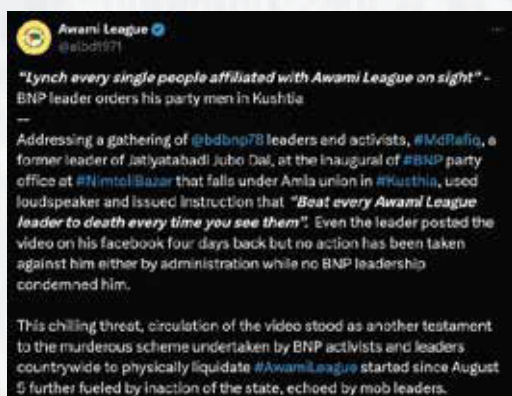

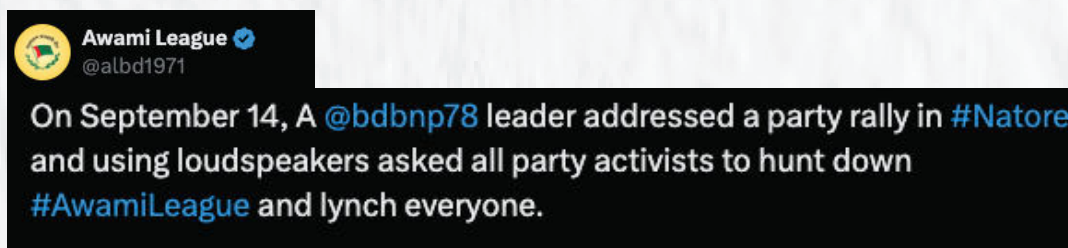

44 deaths in mob violence in 2 months

According to a report by rights organisation Manabdhikar Shongskriti Foundation, in September alone, at least 238 cases were filed against Awami League members indiscriminately. In the aftermath of August 5, more than 200 cases were filed against Sheikh Hasina. An assessment of 506 cases reveal at least 45,547 individuals were named comprising leaders, activists and citizens affiliated with Awami League with a further 1,98,790 unnamed accused. Citizens including writers, journalists, rights activists viewed as not loyal to BNP Jamaat, alongside leaders and activists from Awami League, are extorted and threatened on condition of including names on the unnamed accused section. Evidence of extortion and harassment in these cases have become rampant amid a collusion between police and activists of BNP Jamaat e Islami at local level, according to victims, though not widely reported.

BNP leaders publicly directing activists to lynch Awami League on sight but not arrested



Addressing a gathering of BNP leaders and activists, Md Rafiq, a former leader of Jatiyatabadi Jubo Dal, at the inaugural of BNP party office at Nimtoli Bazar that falls under Amla union in Kusthia, used loudspeaker and issued instruction that "Beat every Awami League leader to death every time you see them". Even the leader posted the video on his Facebook four days back but no action has been taken against him either by administration while no BNP leadership condemned him.

Former social welfare minister Dipu Moni and former deputy sports minister Arif Khan Joy were physically assaulted when they were being taken to court for a remand hearing in a murder case on Tuesday.

Witnesses said that pro-BNP lawyers reached over the significant police escort to land blows on both the accused, who were being produced before court for a remand hearing in a case filed over the death of grocery shop owner Abu Saad in Dhaka's Mohammodpur on July 23.

Following the hearing, Dhaka Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Sultan Sobag Uddin placed Dipu Moni on a four-day remand and Joy on a five-day remand.

In the courtroom, pro-BNP Jamaat lawyers chanted slogans demanding their execution. They were continuing their protest inside the courtroom until the hearing was completed.

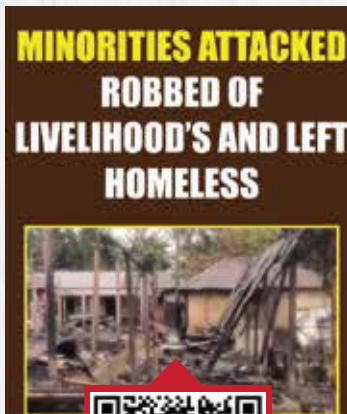

Temples get letters demanding Tk 500,000 in Durga Puja extortion

Ransom demanded for celebration of biggest religious festival of hindus Extortion threats on Hindu temples and puja committees, demanding payments of 5 lakh Bangladeshi taka, just days ahead of the Durga Puja festival, the biggest religious festival for the minorities. Turmoil forced cancellation of key Durga puja celebration in Dhaka, covid time restriction Ramakrishna Mission cancels holding of Kumari Puja, an essential element of Durga Puja on the occasion of Mohashtomi, in Dhaka. Also pujas will be held inside the mission compound, an exception to previous years. These restrictions were only applied during Covid. But now the reign of noble peace laureate Dr Yunus forced minorities to celebrate the biggest festival in line with curtailment of freedom.

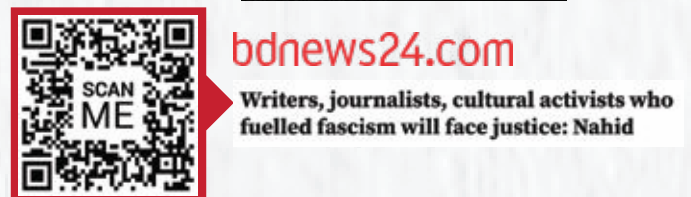

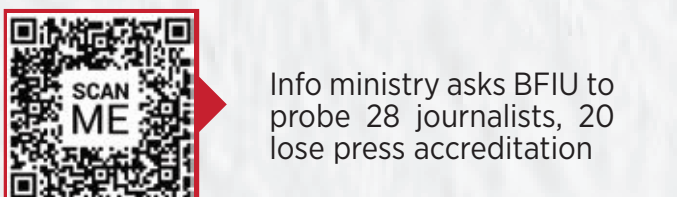
AP reports at least 150 journalists are framed in murder charges and crimes against humanity drawing criticism from groups like Paris-based Reporters Without Borders, or RSF, and the Human Rights Watch. According to Reporters Without Borders (RSF) there has been systematic judicial harassment of journalists and there is a purge of journalists under the new regime. Despite this call journalists continued to be booked in false charges, a tool to intimidate press for self-censorship. Even offices of eight media stations were attacked, journalists were purged, expulsion of journalists from press clubs, threat to burn down media outlets are issued with full impunity. Yet the Information advisor vowed to continue persecution of journalists, writers and poets slapping a tag of “enablers of fascist”, defying the global condemnation.

Dr Yunus led regime orchestrated repressive measures against journalists expanded beyond the efforts of criminalizing journalists as the information ministry issues “highly classified” directives to different state organs to deploy measures including putting curb on access of journalists to government offices and initiating probe into bank accounts to instill further climate of fear within the fraternity. On the other hand, intimidation has been employed to block statements issued by independent rights organizations of rights abuses under the regime.



Politicisation of Judiciary

Within days into taking charge, the unelected regime forced five judges including chief justice to resign and publicly vowed to bring in sweeping changes in the judiciary to make it independent. But in a stark betrayal to the pledge, Bangladesh Nationalist Party's Human Affairs Secretary was appointed as the attorney general. On the other hand, politically affiliated with Jamaat e Islami lawyers including the chief prosecutor were appointed in International Crimes Tribunal, that has been tasked with investigating killings took place in the run down to the fall of Awami League, a testament of pursuing political vendetta against Awami League.

Under direct patronization of Dr Yunus led regime, using the banner of Students against discrimination (SAD), his supporters laid siege to judiciary for several turns, demanded removal of the judges they consider as dissenters and inclusion of judges they deemed loyalists, circumventing total disregard to snatch away independence of judiciary and completely manipulate the key state organ. Lawyers and legal experts termed the appointment of partisan people as judges to run the judiciary and conduct trial process a grave violation of human rights. Several politically affiliated lawyers who defended Jamaat e Islami and lawyers held ranks with BNP were appointed in key places to run the judiciary, a move described as further coercive measures to manipulate judiciary.

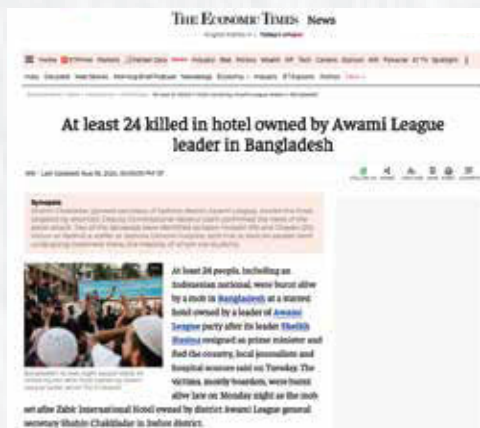

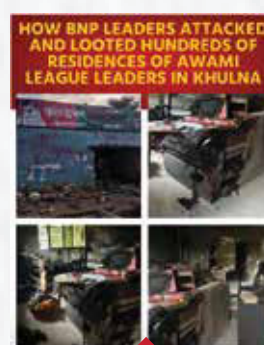
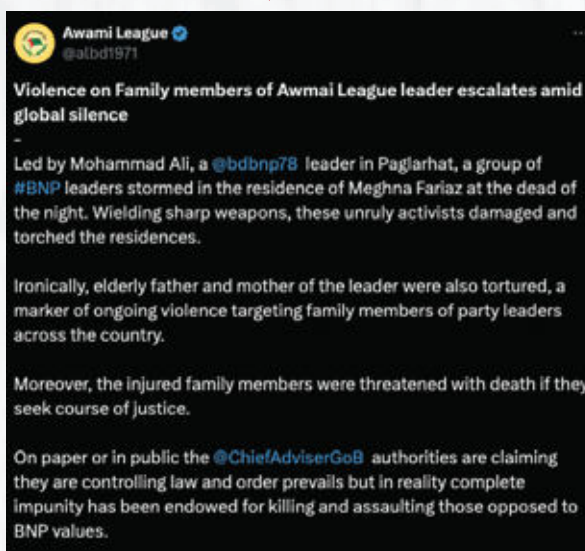
